Baptism makes us a part of Christ's living and lifegiving self and makes us alive with Christ's life. As the vine brings food to the branches, Christ feeds us at his table. We are sent out to bear fruit for the life of the world.

Wise Words



Each January I spend a part of the day reviewing my journal and praying for God's guidance and wisdom as we begin a new year. One area I felt God leading me in was deeper study of the Word, especially the Sermon on the Mount.

The Sermon on the Mount is found in Matthew 5-7 and is one of Jesus' longest teachings. Though some of the passages are hard, just imagine the peace and love that would be experienced if we all

lived according to Jesus' words.

I felt God wanted me to study these passages, but I was uncertain where to start. The answer came last month in one of the weekly emails from Bishop Beaudoin. Each newsletter he mentions books he is reading and podcasts he is listening to. Last month he listed the Bible Project yearlong podcast all about the Sermon on the Mount. Here is the link if you want to listen. It is great. <u>https://bibleproject.com/podcasts/</u>

Once a week (and I am still catching up) the podcast gives a deep dive into the history and meaning of words and what Jesus was teaching from these passages. They do this in NPR style, with segments, music, and fascinating interviews. It is NOT boring academics! Other resources are mentioned too. One book I recently purchased to accompany this study is Sermon on the Mount: A Beginner's Guide to the Kingdom of Heaven by Dr. Amy-Jill Levine.

Some things I am learning:

- Insights into the original words from Greek and Hebrew. Our English often doesn't translate well or completely.
- How the context of the Sermon on the Mount is influenced by Jewish culture.
- · What it would have been like living in first century Israel and hearing these words.
- How much the Old Testament is referred to in this teaching of Jesus. There are references and patterns I never noticed before.

I am so grateful to find this podcast to deepen my knowledge and experience in exploring the Sermon on the Mount. Check it out! I bet you will learn too and what better way to grow closer to God than through the Bible. How are you studying the Bible this year?

Worship Focus for May

May 4 & 5 Sixth Weekend of Easter This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve; but for John's gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

May 11 & 12 Seventh Weekend of Easter

The gospel for Easter's seventh Sunday is always taken from the long prayer Jesus prays for his followers in John's gospel on the night before his death, and always includes Jesus' desire that his followers will be one as he and the Father are one. This oneness is not mere doctrinal agreement or institutional unity, but mutual abiding, interpenetrating life, mutual love, and joy. This oneness is the work of the Spirit whom we have received but also await. Come, Holy Spirit!

May 18 & 19 Day of Pentecost

Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Crossing all boundaries that would separate us, the Spirit brings the wideness of God's mercy to places we least expect it—to a crowd of strangers of different lands and tongues, to dry bones, to our weak hearts. Jesus promises his disciples that they will be accompanied by the Holy Spirit, and that this Spirit reveals the truth. We celebrate that we too have been visited with this same Spirit. Guided by the truth, we join together in worship, and then disperse to share the fullness of Christ's love with the world.

May 25 & 26 The Holy Trinity

When we say God is the triune God, we are saying something about who God is beyond, before, and after the universe: that there is community within God. Our experience of this is reflected in Paul's words today. When we pray to God as Jesus prayed to his Abba (an everyday, intimate parental address), the Spirit prays within us, creating between us and God the same relationship Jesus has with the one who sent him.
